Thank you again! The committee is most appreciative of all your efforts.

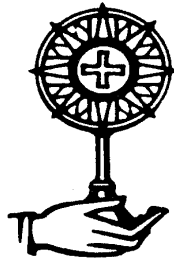

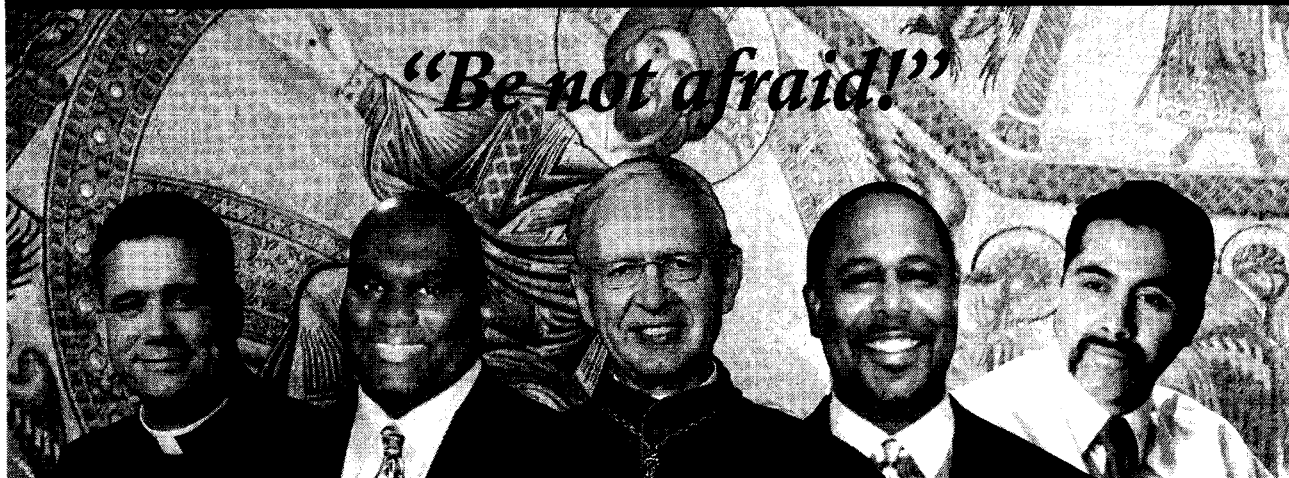

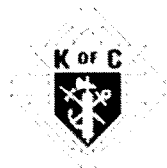
