**RESPECT LIFE APOSTOLATE - Pastoral Care**

Without real and practical assistance to those in need, there can be no genuine *Culture of Life*. The RLA's work in Pastoral areC works to insure that every woman in a crisis pregnancy has a viable alternative to abortion. It also includes efforts to help men and woman who have had an abortion experience to find hope and healing.

**The LifeLine Coalition** - is a group of Catholic social service agencies and pro life caregivers who are committed to helping women experiencing crisis pregnancies. It was formed to: increase awareness and availability of pregnancy assistance services, generate new revenue for caregivers and expand services to pregnant women. **LifeLine Coalition** provides assistance to more than 10,000 mothers and their children annually. This organization provides women experiencing a crisis pregnancy with help in the following ways: Medical expenses, food, clothing, housing, educational counseling, adoption services and spiritual guidance. Members of the **LifeLine Coalition** include: Birthright Counseling, Our Lady's Inn and Good Shepherd Children and Family Services.

**Spotlight on Birthright Counseling - Birthright,**

an emergency service for any girl or woman distressed by an untimely pregnancy, provides positive alternatives to abortion. The underlying principle of *Birthright* upholds "the right of every mother to give birth, the right of every child to be born." While each call from an expectant mother is wholly confidential, an appointment can be made with a trained staff social worker who will ensure all available resources are at her disposal. When existing resources cannot adequately address the expectant mother's needs, Birthright provides financial assistance, legal service and medical care. Birthright Counseling, St. Louis has five offices in the metropolitan area and three independent *Birthright* offices serving the outlying areas of the Archdiocese. Each is an affiliate of Birthright International. These offices are independent entities with their own boards, staffs and volunteers. They include Tri-County in Eureka, Hillsboro and Wentzville.
