Pro Life News

It is impossible to further the common good without acknowledging and defending the right to life, upon which all other inalienable rights of individuals are founded." RESPECT LIFE APOSTOLATE - Public Policy

An important component of the work of the **RLA** is its effort to impact public policy. Without successfully improving our laws, our efforts to educate and provide abortion alternatives will achieve limited results. The RLA works in close cooperation with the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and the Missouri Catholic Conference (MCC) to keep the people of the Archdiocese informed about legislation on the state and federal levels. The **MCC** is the public policy arm of the Catholic Church in Missouri. It's mission is to provide the Catholic dioceses of Missouri with up to date information about legislative developments and public policy in Missouri. An important component of good citizenship is exercising the responsibility to vote.

Voter Registration and Get-Out-The-Vote - Voter registration campaigns are held in our Parish as a service to the community and the Parish. **March for Life** - Since abortion was legalized in 1973, hundreds of pro life activists from all over the country have gathered annually in Washington DC for the Jan. 22 March for Life. The **Missouri Right to Life** sponsors and organizes a three-day caravan to the event that is open to all. The Parish Pro Life Committee has financially supported teens from Incarnate Word who attend. Last year 18 teens made this pilgrimage to defend the right to life. A documentary, *Thine Eyes - A Witness to the March for Life* followed a group of students from Benedictine College. *"It tells a simple, but profound story which has been largely pushed to the side by the commercial press; how hundreds of thousands of men, women and children make a challenging, spiritual pilgrimage to our nation's capitol - year after year - out of love for human life, and come back home more committed than ever to change our country."* Most Reverend Robert W. Finn, Bishop of Kansas City - St. Joseph.

We will show this documentary at our July 21st Pro Life Committee meeting starting at 7:00 pm in the Multipurpose Room. All are invited and encouraged to attend.
