RESPECT LIFE ACTION ALERT:

Reform Health Care & Protect Human Life and Dignity

In our Catholic tradition, health care is a basic human right. Access to health care should not depend on where a person works, how much a family earns, or where a person lives. Instead, every person, created in the image and likeness of God, has the right to life and those things necessary to sustain life, including affordable, quality health care. The teaching is rooted in the biblical call to heal the sick and to serve "the least of these," our concern for human life and dignity, and the principle of the common good. ***The national health care bill does not exclude abortions.*** Currently both versions of the health care bill in the House and Senate will require abortion coverage funded or subsidized by your tax dollars. If you have not already done so, Contact your U.S. senators and representative's district offices and ask them to specifically exclude abortion from the health care reform plan, as well as include specific protections for health care providers' rights of conscience. In addition, health care reform must not contain provisions that mandate or encourage the withdrawal or curtailment of effective life-sustaining treatment to the terminally ill, the chronically ill, or the permanently disabled. The **U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops** is actively communicating with legislators to ensure that any health care reform legislation includes Catholic values and a respect for the dignity of all human life. You can learn more about what they are doing, read statements from bishops and see a Q&A on the issues on their website: www.usccb.org/healthcare Your legislators really do listen to your calls. 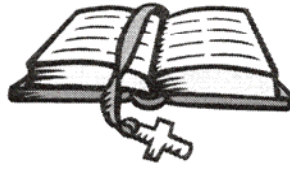
