*"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." (Mark 9:35)*

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus teaches us through His words and through His life that we are called to serve one another. We can serve through our sacrifices of time, talent and treasure. Sacrifice is not a word that many people like to hear. We think it means that we must give up something that we want. However, the literal meaning of sacrifice is "to make holy" from the words "sacer" = sacred, and "facere" = to make. In other words, we make our lives holy by giving up some of our time, talent and treasure in service of God and His Church.

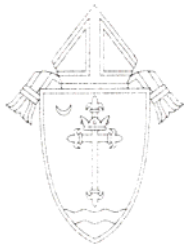

## Stewardship Awareness Sunday Pastoral Letter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Although today the Archdiocese of St. Louis marks its 9<sup>th</sup> annual celebration of Stewardship Awareness Sunday, for me it is my first opportunity to write to you about stewardship.

During my short time here in the Archdiocese of St. Louis, I have already seen that the people of this Archdiocese are good and generous people. I have been overwhelmed by all that you have given and all that you have accomplished. For that I am most grateful.

Yet in their pastoral letter on stewardship, the US Catholic Bishops remind us that, *"At every step forward, one is challenged to go further in accepting and loving God's will."* Today, I am asking each of you to consider whether Jesus might be calling you to take one more step forward in your spiritual and stewardship journey.

Stewardship begins by opening our hearts to God's will for us. To know God's will for us, we must spend time with God. We all need to give time each day to be alone with Jesus in prayer. Make a stewardship pledge to find more time for prayer.

During your time in prayer thank God for all the many blessings and gifts that He has given to you. Then ask God what He wants you to do with those gifts right now, right here, in this time and in this Church. Is there some service or some sacrifice that you can offer? Can you step forward and volunteer in your parish community? Can you increase your financial support?

I am not asking you for more money or more time. I am simply asking you to pray so that you will know what God wants you to do with the gifts He has entrusted to your care. As individuals and as families, we all have some prayer, some service or some sacrifice that we can give. If you hear Jesus calling you to do more, please do not hesitate. Our Church greatly needs the gifts that God is counting on you to give.

May your faithful stewardship bring peace to your heart and joy to your life.
