She told her counselor that she had a serious argument with the father of the baby and is afraid that their relationship is beginning to suffer and she is afraid of losing him. She's in her fifth month now and is worried that the stress she feels may be affecting the baby. After visiting with her doctor he said everything is fine but suggested that she look for ways to reduce her anxiety level in order to prevent premature labor from beginning. Her counselor spent this month's session helping Kiara fill out paperwork for income assistance. Please know that the assistance received from Incarnate Word supporters is greatly appreciated.
