"40 DAYS FOR LIFE" CAMPAIGN

As we begin the last week of the "40 Days for Life" campaign, please consider spending an hour at the Planned Parenthood Clinic, praying for the women who are considering abortion, that they change their minds and decide to give birth to their baby. During this Fall campaign, with over 200 cities participating, 299 children have been spared from abortion. Last week, St. Louis had their first confirmed **baby saved!** It is because of the dedicated prayer witnesses and support of the sidewalk counselors that we hear more and more stories of women who are changing their minds. The sidewalk counselor was able to give this young mother the information that she has many other recourses to consider and convinced her to go to the nearby Pregnancy Resource Center for the support she would need to keep her baby. There are always at least two prayer witnesses during those hours. 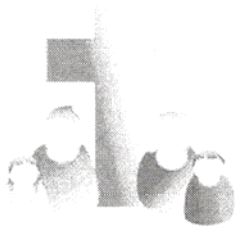
