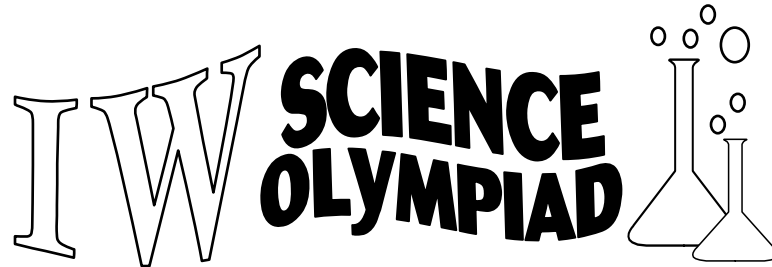


- *Where can you go and meet a robot?*

A variety of professionals, working in science-related organizations, will share their knowledge and skills by setting up exhibits and demonstrations. Olympiad visitors can move from one exhibit to the next, experiencing the wonders of technology, medicine, astronomy, the environment and other areas of science. Children, accompanied by adults, will have a chance to look, listen, touch and learn about science.
